### Pupil Premium Funding Information



In 2017-18 Ebchester CE Primary School will receive directly from Government the sum of £23,760 to help us to close the gap in learning between those less advantaged pupils and the national and school expectations of attainment. The Pupil Premium is calculated on the number of children who have been on free school meals at any time during the previous 6 years of education, those who are in the care of a local authority and those who are from families who are part of the Armed Forces.
