<u>The school makes me aware of</u> <u>what my child will learn during the</u> <u>year.</u>	At the beginning of every half-term, we send out a curriculum leaflet which details what your child will be learning in each subject. We hope that these leaflets keep you informed. The school website is a great source of information about what pupils are learning in school. You can find this information under the 'curriculum' link. As always, if you have any questions about what your child is doing in school, please make an appointment to see your child's teacher who will be more than happy to answer any questions you may have.
<u>The school lets me know how my</u> <u>child is doing.</u>	At the end of the autumn and spring term, you receive a mini report which outlines where your child is in relation to age related expectations in Writing, Reading, Maths and Grammar. In the summer term, we provide a longer, more detailed report which gives feedback about your child's progress across all curriculum subjects. You have an opportunity to meet with your child's class teacher twice a year – in the autumn and spring term. However, teaching staff are available to answer any questions about your child's progress at any stage during the school year. Contact school if you would like to make an appointment.
If yes, how strongly they agree with this statement: 'My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed.'	All SEND pupils have a support plan. You are invited into school to discuss the plan and the progress your child has made during review meetings – every three months. In addition, if your child has an EHCP or receives Top-Up funding, you are invited into school on a half- termly basis to discuss the support that has been given and the progress your child has made. If staff have concerns regarding SEND, behavioural or mental health issues, initially you will be invited into school to discuss what support we can provide to meet your child's needs.
